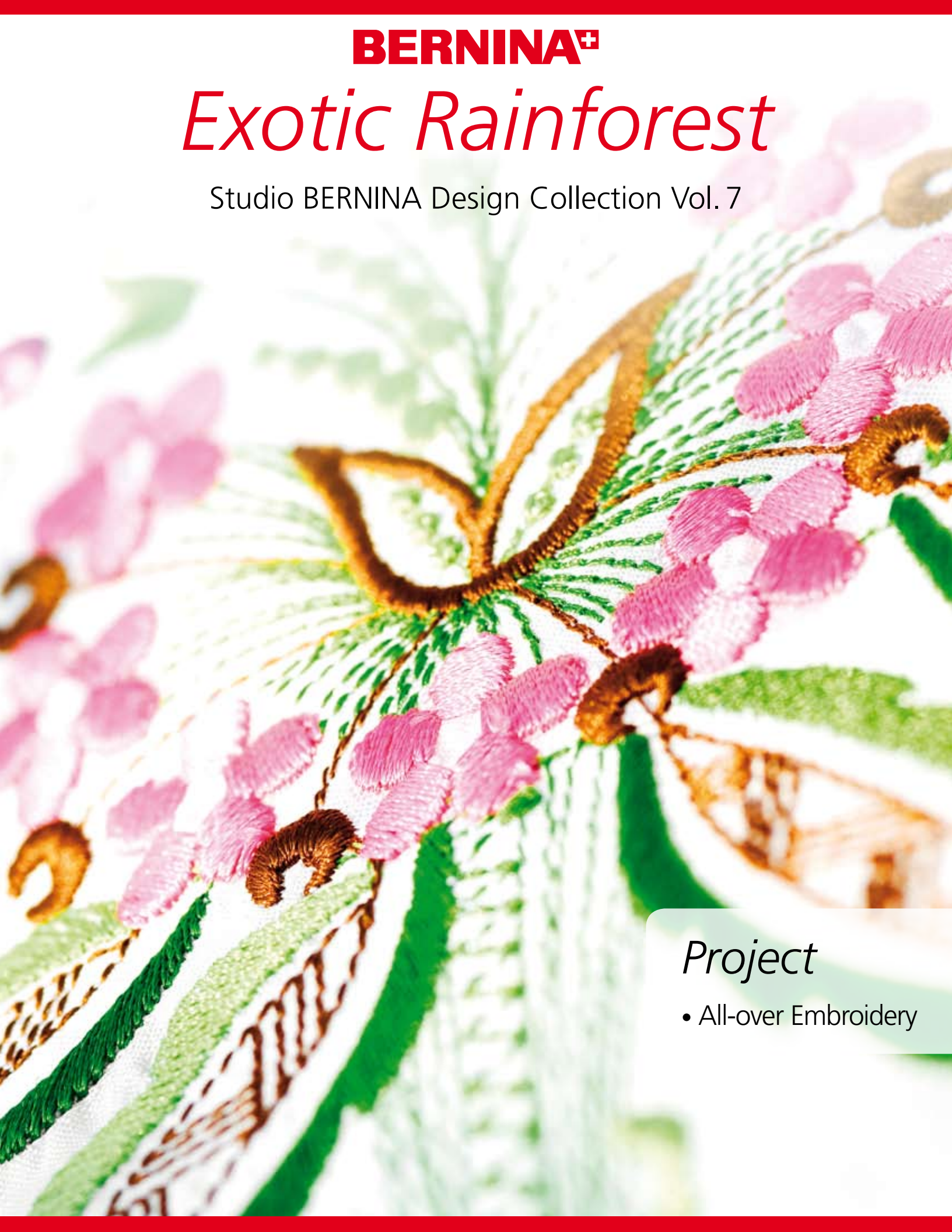

- All-over Embroidery

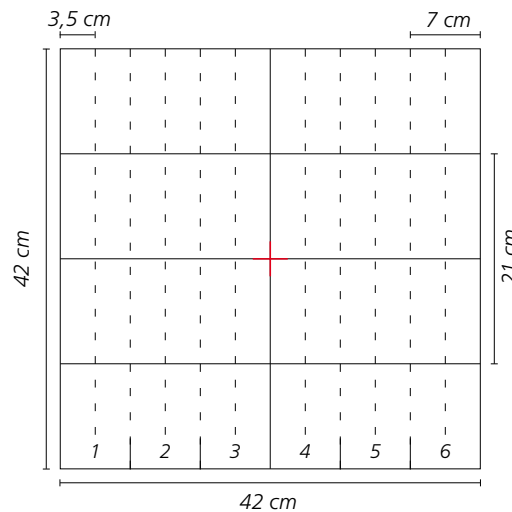
All-over embroidery

Sewing instructions:

Embroidery design: BE10742

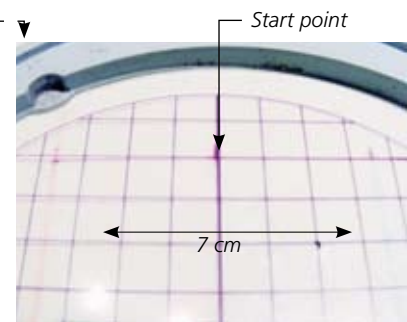
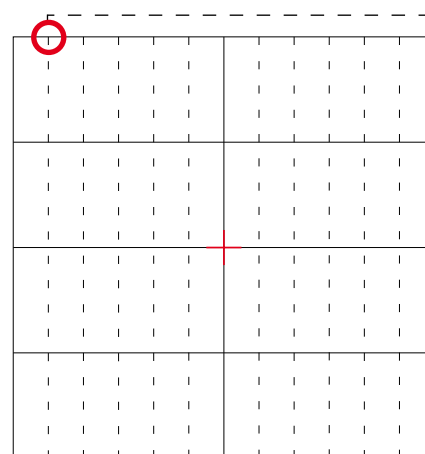
Markings for the all-over fill:

Mark the unembroidered inside area (66 cm x 66 cm) of the corner border embroidery with a vertical and a horizontal line. Mark the area to be embroidered from the centre-point outwards, as shown in the graphic. Within the corner border embroidery, a 42 cm x 42 cm area is filled with all-over embroidery. The total embroidery area consists of 36 individual pattern repeats in all. This corresponds to 12 oval hoops, i.e. 6 x 2 oval hoop repeats in two sequenced lines.

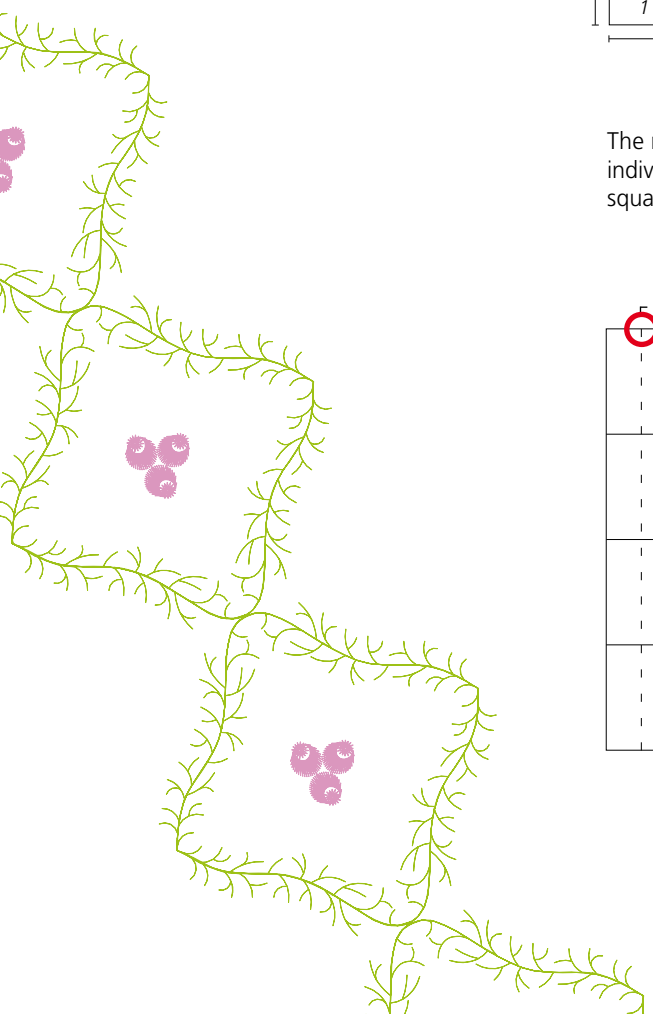


Divisions for the all-over embroidery

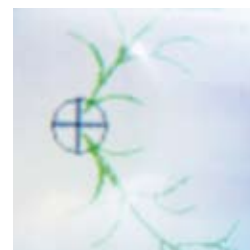
The marked lines allow you to hoop and rehoop your embroidery project precisely. The individual pattern is square: 7 cm x 7 cm. To help with rehooping, the hoop-template squares can be counted off. This is a quite useful when joining patterns on the side.



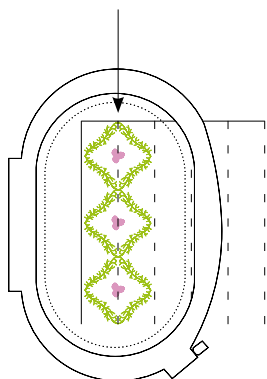
When the fabric is hooped, the template lines run over the entire all-over pattern in both a vertical and horizontal direction parallel to the marking lines.



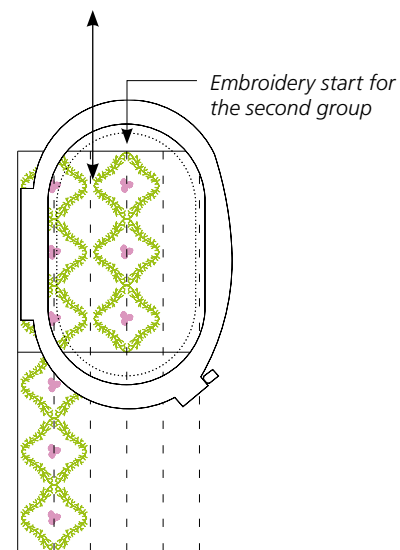
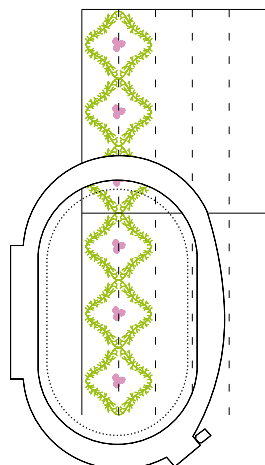
To check the side match, you can scroll down to the side tip with the Embroidery Sequence Control and verify where the needle penetrates.



First stitch of the pattern

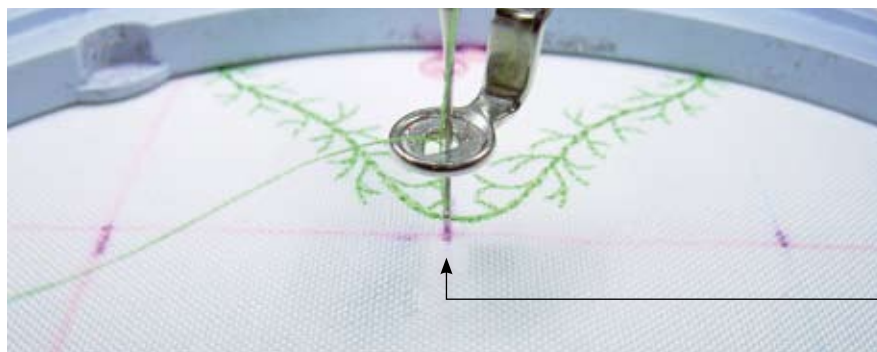


Embroidering the first pattern repeat

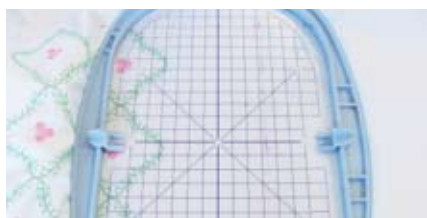


Hooping to embroider the second pattern repeat:

Unhoop the embroidery project and join the second pattern repeat as shown in the photo. After embroidering the first group of 6, hoop the project so that the first stitch of the second group once again penetrates at the same height of the marked line. When joining the second pattern repeat, the first stitch penetrates below, at the tip of the previously embroidered pattern repeat.

Embroider the entire marked area using this technique.



Finishing the tablecloth:

Cut away the embroidery stabiliser and wash the tablecloth. The stabiliser must dissolve out completely. Iron, and finish with a hem of your choice.
